Build Your Roadside Toolkit

Start with the basics. These first few essentials cover communication, emergencies, and everyday tire safety — the foundation of any well-prepared vehicle.

ITEM 01

Fully Charged Mobile Phone & Car Charger

Your phone is your most important roadside safety tool. Keep a charging cable and a car charger or portable power bank so you can always call for help or use the JIB app.



ITEM 02

Emergency Roadside Kit

A basic roadside kit should include:

- Jumper cables
- Flashlight
- Reflective triangles or road flares
- Multi-tool
- Work gloves
- Basic first-aid supplies



ITEM 03

Tire Pressure Gauge

Underinflated tires are one of the leading causes of roadside breakdowns. Check your tire pressure monthly to improve safety and fuel efficiency.



Stay Comfortable & Visible

Whether it's Georgia summer heat or an unexpected storm, these items keep you safe, seen, and comfortable while you wait for help.



ITEM 04

Portable Tire Inflator

A compact air compressor can quickly refill a low tire and may help you reach a safer location or nearby repair shop.



ITEM 05

Water and Healthy Snacks

Atlanta traffic can be unpredictable. Keep bottled water and non-perishable snacks in case you're delayed while waiting for assistance.



ITEM 06

Reflective Safety Vest

If you need to exit your vehicle, a reflective vest makes you much more visible to passing traffic, especially at night or during bad weather.



Be Ready for Anything

Round out your kit with items for changing weather, important paperwork, and a backup way to get your engine running.



ITEM 07

Blanket or Emergency Poncho

Weather can change quickly. A blanket helps during cold temperatures, while a rain poncho keeps you dry if you must leave your vehicle.



ITEM 08

Paper Copy of Important Information

Keep a printed copy of:

- Vehicle registration
- Insurance information
- Emergency contact numbers

Store these documents in a waterproof folder.



ITEM 09

Portable Battery Jump Starter

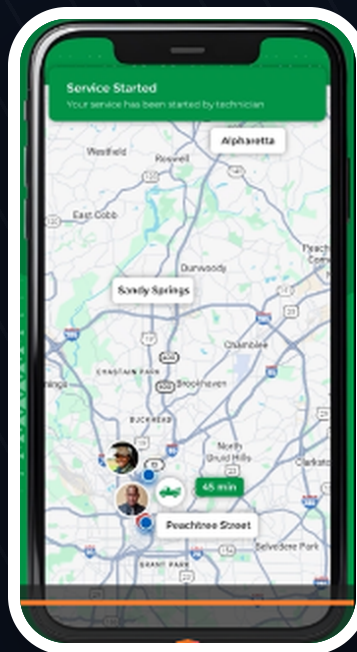
Unlike traditional jumper cables, a portable jump starter allows you to restart many vehicles without needing another driver for assistance.

Bonus Tips for Atlanta Drivers

Small habits that make a big difference before you're ever stranded.



Check your tire pressure at least once a month.



Share your location with a trusted family member if you're stranded.



Keep your fuel tank above one-quarter full, especially during severe weather.



Park in well-lit areas whenever possible.



Test your battery before the summer heat or winter cold.



Stay inside your vehicle with the doors locked if waiting in an unfamiliar area, unless remaining inside is unsafe.



Save your emergency contacts in your phone.



Review your owner's manual so you know where the spare tire and jack are located.



Keep your phone charged before long trips.
